**PRAYERS FOR THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED**

Our Catholic Faith encourages us to pray for the dead. Just as we can help one another in this life with our love and our prayers, so we can help those souls who are still detained in Purgatory—a condition of passive suffering and purification as they await the glory of heaven. The souls in Purgatory know that they will be saved, and so they experience a certain joy. But it is joy in the midst of suffering while they await the fulfillment of their hope. Our prayers and sacrifices can lessen the sufferings these souls must endure, and can hasten their entrance into eternal happiness. Prayer for the dead is not an option—it is an obligation. It is a spiritual work of mercy which all Catholics are bound to perform. November 2nd, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, is an annual reminder of this obligation. In fact, our Catholic tradition sets aside the entire month of November as a time especially devoted to praying for the dead. During the first eight days of November, the Church grants a plenary indulgence which can be applied to a soul in Purgatory simply by visiting and praying in a cemetery. In other words, on any and each of those eight days, if you visit a cemetery and pray there, you can gain the complete remission of all of the sins of a soul in Purgatory. The conditions for gaining a plenary indulgence are: to be in a state of grace (by going to confession and receiving Holy Communion within seven days of performing the work, and by being free of all attachment to sin); and to offer prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father, one Hail Mary and one Glory Be). Please take advantage of this wonderful opportunity to help the poor souls in Purgatory!  
*Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord,  
and let perpetual light shine upon them.  
May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed,  
through the mercy of God rest in peace.*

A November Tradition during the month of November, the church remembers and prays for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, those faithful Christians who have died and gone before us, but who still must atone for their sins in order to enter heaven free of all sin. Two copies of this book will be set up in the church. We invite you to make a book page to honor a deceased loved one. Plastic 8 ½ x 11 page protectors are in each book ready to hold the pages you design. Consider making a page for a loved one. Bring the page to church, offer a prayer for your loved one, and add the page to either book. Materials will be available on a table in the church library if you choose to design a page here.
